ACE Fellows Program

Nomination Form and Application Packet Due: November 1 each year.

The ACE Fellows spend an extended period of time on another campus, working directly with presidents and other senior leaders to observe how they address strategic planning, resource allocation, development, policy, and other issues and challenges. Year-long and semester-long options available.

Fee for Year-Long Placement. The **host institution pays the \$7,500 program fee** and provides the Fellow with a professional development budget of up to \$14,000 to attend seminars and national meetings, and to visit other campuses.

Fee for Semester-Long Placement. The **nominating and host institutions each pay \$3,750** toward the \$7,500 program fee, and each institution contributes one-half of the professional development budget (approximately \$7,000 per institution), which enables Fellows to attend seminars and national meetings, and to visit other campuses.
